Supply Nation's Connect 2019 showcases the increasing maturity, growth and achievements of the Indigenous business sector

Over 2,500 people from across Australia and the globe will gather for Australia's largest Indigenous business event, Supply Nation's Connect 2019.

Supply Nation's CEO, Laura Berry, says "In this, Supply Nation's 10th year of operation, Connect will bring together some of the pioneers of supplier diversity, together with some of our newest business voices to create a space where the Australian supplier diversity community can learn, grow and connect."

This year, Supply Nation's premier event will showcase the sheer size, maturity and growth of the sector through the number and calibre of Indigenous business exhibiting as well as the diverse backgrounds of the Supplier Diversity Award finalists.

Ms Berry continues, "Recent results from the Federal Government's Indigenous Procurement Policy illustrate that the Indigenous business sector is growing exponentially year on year — and we're definitely seeing that at Supply Nation with the rapid growth in the number of Indigenous businesses listed on our directory, and in the record numbers of corporate and government members that work with us."

Over 400 international and local delegates will gather at the Knowledge Forum to explore this year's theme, 'the power of an idea'. Almost 200 Indigenous businesses will showcase their products to more than 1500 buyers at the Indigenous Business Tradeshow; and on the final night – the supplier diversity community will gather to celebrate the achievements of the sector at the Gala Awards Dinner.

During the red-carpet Gala Awards Dinner, the winners of the 2019 Supplier Diversity Awards will be announced. Finalists (listed below) represent a cross-section of more than 1,900 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander businesses now listed on Indigenous Business Direct (Supply Nation's database) and of Supply Nation's membership of over 425 corporate, government and not-for-profit organisations.

From the most successful organisations to the individuals who are exceeding expectations and creating change through their powerful ideas and business acumen, the Supplier Diversity Awards are the highest recognition of achievement in Australian supplier diversity.

Ms Berry also made an announcement: "We're also excited to be able to share that we have secured the international sensation Jessica Mauboy, a proud Kuku Yalanji woman, as our headline act for the evening. Her star power and incredible talent will ensure the celebration of the best in the Indigenous business sector ends on a high note."
