Supplier Diversity Award winners announced at Connect 2023

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Supply Nation's annual flagship event for the Indigenous business sector, **Connect**, returned to Gadigal Country, transforming the ICC Sydney into a hub of learning, collaboration, and relationship-building.

This year's theme – Empowering Indigenous Futures – spoke to the significant political, social and economic changes that have led to greater outcomes for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. In her welcoming address at last night's Gala Awards Dinner, Supply Nation Executive Director, Michelle Deshong, reflected on the monumental historical shift on the horizon, in the upcoming referendum:

"Tonight, we find ourselves on the precipice of a hugely significant change, and one that will be pivotal in setting Australia's course for generations to come... This nation has an opportunity to reframe our terms of engagement, and these are the historical moments that shape our generations. Our people are certainly poised to harness this opportunity."

Deshong expressed her gratitude for the opportunity to lead Supply Nation over the past nine months, as Interim CEO, watching the Indigenous business sector break new ground and harness its power to generate positive outcomes for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and non-Indigenous Australians alike, before handing the reins to Supply Nation's new CEO, Kate Russell.

Connect 2023 was the biggest to date – with over 2,400 Indigenous businesses, corporate and government members, international delegates and attendees through the Tradeshow doors. Tradeshow hosts, Carla McGrath and Dan Bouchier harnessed the energy on the Tradeshow floor and guided everyone through an action-packed day of entertainment, panel discussions, interviews and networking.

The morning kicked off with a warm Welcome to Country from Nathan Moran of the Metropolitan Local Aboriginal Land Council and Didgeridoo performance from Brendan Kerin, with heartfelt performances from Buuja Buuja Butterfly Dance Group, Harbour Beizam, De Greer Yindimincarlie and Buluuy Mirrii as the day went on. Panel discussions were held throughout the day at the Knowledge Forum, where changemakers and industry leaders shared their truths with packed crowds, exploring key issues facing the sector.

With the Tradeshow doors closed, the Gala Awards Dinner opened in a powerful celebration of Blak excellence with over 1,200 guests. Hosted by media and entertainment giants, Narelda Jacobs and Luke Carroll, the night celebrated the success of the supplier diversity community and recognised outstanding individuals and organisations at the Supplier Diversity Awards, with the winners announced throughout the course of the evening.

Aunty Joan Bell of the Metropolitan Local Aboriginal Land Council delivered a fiercely emotive Welcome to Gadigal Country before Harbour Beizam and Brolga Dance Academy, Budjerah, and Electric Fields took the stage to share their breathtaking stories through music and dance.
