Supplier Diversity Awards Winners Announced

Winners were announced at the Gala Awards Dinner on Thursday 29 August in Meanjin, as part of Connect 2024, the largest national Indigenous business event.

Connect 2024 held for the first time in Meanjin on the lands of the Turrbal and Jagera peoples at the Brisbane Convention and Exhibition Centre saw over two hundred businesses exhibiting at the Indigenous Business Tradeshow with more than 3500 participants travelling from all over Australia and overseas to attend the two-day event.

Supply Nation's Chief Executive Officer, Kate Russell said the Supplier Diversity Awards are a way to support and recognise excellence amongst businesses that are committed to diversified procurement policies and the benefits of working with Indigenous businesses.

"Despite ongoing challenges including the outcome of last year's Referendum, Indigenous businesses remain resilient, optimistic, and committed to their values, and this is driving growth and success. The Supplier Diversity Awards honour organisations and individuals that are making a positive difference to prosperity and their communities, and that is something worth celebrating," said Ms Russell.
