Supply Nation's Supplier Diversity Awards 2025 finalists announced

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Supply Nation is pleased to announce the finalists in the annual Supplier Diversity Awards.

The awards recognise individuals, businesses and government agencies making significant contributions to the Indigenous business sector.

Award winners for all 11 categories will be announced at the Connect 2025 Gala Awards Dinner on Thursday 21 August. The night will conclude Australia's largest and most influential Indigenous business event connecting verified Indigenous suppliers with corporate and government buyers.

Now in its 16th year, Connect will return to Gadigal Land at ICC Sydney, having been held in in Meanjin on the lands of the Turrbal and Jagera peoples last year. The theme for this year's event is 'Beyond the Horizon'. After celebrating our 15-year anniversary, we look to where land, sea and sky meet, ready to break new ground and help shape the future of Indigenous business.

Supply Nation's Chief Executive Officer and proud Awabakal woman, Kate Russell said there is a lot to celebrate, with both the growth and diversity of the sector, but the benefits are even more far reaching when the broader social value is considered. Indigenous-owned businesses are contributing to the prosperity of all Australians.

Supply Nation now has over 5,700 verified Indigenous businesses listed on its national database, Indigenous Business Direct, and more than 850 corporate, government and non-profit members. Indigenous-owned businesses are contributing \$16 billion to the Australian economy each year and paying \$4.2 billion in wages.

"Despite the success, challenges remain from both domestic and international drivers. Indigenous entrepreneurs still find it difficult to access capital to support start-ups or expansion. There is a need for more support around building business knowledge and skills as well as accessing support services and grants. Unconscious and conscious bias negatively impacts the potential of businesses. The Connect 2025 Knowledge Forum aims to address and discuss some of these obstacles."

"In addition to the Tradeshow hosting hundreds of Indigenous exhibitors across all industries, the Supplier Diversity Awards recognise Blak excellence and highlight corporate and government organisations that are committed to diversified procurement and the benefits of these policies and practices," she said.
